I also hope you like the ongoing modified format of this month's **Dashboard**. I want to make it less formal and easier to read, and as always, I encourage your input and suggestions!



There were plenty of Chickenfoot and Texas Hold'em games in the evenings to keep us entertained if sight-seeing and story-swapping weren't enough.



We were happy to welcome new members, Iris and Jerry (their first event to participate in), hope you enjoyed yourself and enjoy COCCC!


Next year, the Springfield Club is hosting in Branson. THIS IS A GREAT EVENT!!!!!














