One of four boys, his brothers have helped him master the tyke and he "tells others that he now rides in the street" - that means the circle of their street's cul-de-sac. He is thrilled with the tyke and his "wheels."

Comments from your club president

Adeline and I bought our 1954 Chevrolet pickup about five years ago. Bought it in Belton, TX and trailered it home. Our project began then. I heard this kind of project could turn into a “money pit”. Should have paid more attention.

I will describe our venture in stages.

- Near the end of the first year we decided the engine should be rebuilt. Took the truck to Steve Larue here in Edmond. Steve was our next door neighbor and we felt he would do a good job on this overhaul. After the expenditure of much money we emerged with new engine, different transmission, new drive line and differential.
- Some time later we rebuilt the brakes. About a year later we installed disc brakes on the front and experienced problems afterward with them. We took our truck to Larry Myers for help. Our solution to correct the issue was to replace the calipers and pads. Again caused additional expenditure of funds.
- Somewhere along the way we approached Larry again and the result was a new 5 speed transmission. Now we can keep up with all the members of our club when we make our car cruises and meal trips.
- Additionally we added an air conditioner. Great feature as Adeline will now ride with me when the temp is above 60 degrees.

One of the reasons we joined COCCC was to become acquainted with those in the business to help us with our project. We can assure you Larry Myers and Jason Myers have helped us with the majority of our “project”. We are now looking for someone to work on the truck’s body and paint it. Probably won’t get into that this year as our club will be involved with planning the “Fall Foliage Tour” (FFT) for 2018. In the meantime looking forward to FFT, 2017.
